GENERAL RULES

Eisteddfod Rules evolve each year. It is the competitor's responsibility to abide by the most current rules included in this syllabus.

GENERAL BY-LAWS

These notes and entry conditions of the Gladstone Eisteddfod Association Inc. and its Management Committee represent the by-laws and conditions under which the annual Gladstone Eisteddfod is staged. Entry in the Eisteddfod is subject to the acceptance of, and adherence to, all by-laws and conditions.

ASSOCIATION RIGHTS

The Association reserves the following rights:

- to refuse any entry
- to disqualify an entry not meeting the by-laws and conditions
- to re-allocate trophies
- to combine or split sections as the Association sees fit.

ENTRIES

Entry and entry payment is done through Stardom, a Competition Entry System (stardom.com.au).

PLEASE NOTE: there is an additional cost associated with uploading selections (see Own Choice Selections).


Payment must be completed by the closing date. Entries that have not been paid for by the closing date will not be accepted. Secure online payment can be made using a credit card, and direct deposit is also an option. Your entry will only be confirmed once payment has been received.

Prior to logging in to Stardom, we recommend reviewing the syllabus and noting the sections you are interested in. Teachers are permitted to enter on behalf of their students, but in doing so, you will serve as the main contact person for those students. Please ensure that between the competitors in a duo/trio, only one entry for that piece is made (with all competitor's names added).

LOG INTO STARDOM

First time users will need to register with Stardom. Please record your username and password to enable you to check results and to enter in future years. Once logged in, Stardom will guide you through the entry system



BY SUBMITTING ENTRIES, YOU ARE AGREEING TO ABIDE BY THE ASSOCIATION'S RULES OUTLINED IN THE EISTEDDFOD SYLLABUS.

ENTRY REGULATIONS

COMPETITORS

- must understand that by entering the Eisteddfod, they compete at their own risk
- must enter and perform under their own name
- must be in the specified age limit on the <u>1st of January 2024</u>. The Association reserves the right to call
 upon any Competitor at any time to furnish proof of age and to withhold any prize until such proof shall
 be furnished. This rule shall be strictly enforced, and any infringements will disqualify entrants from
 future Eisteddfods.
- are responsible for their own entries

SOLOISTS

Defined as one person participating in the performance (excluding accompanist/page-turner).

Soloists may only compete once per category and only in their own age group. Instrumental competitors
excluded, where a change to another eligible instrument affords another entry.

DUOS/TRIOS

Defined as two to three persons in the performance (excluding an accompanist/page-turner).

- The names of all members of competing Duo/Trios must be submitted within one entry
- Individuals may compete in Duos/Trios, Ensembles, and Groups up into a higher age group provided the eldest performer is in their age group.
- **Instrumental** performers may compete up to 2 times per section provided there is a change to another eligible instrument.
- Dance performers my compete up to 2 times per section provided there is a change of partner or change of style i.e., Classical Ballet and Story Ballet.
- **Speech & Drama** performers may compete up to 2 times per section provided there is a change of partner, excluding improvisation sections.
- Vocal performers may compete up to 2 times per section provided there is a change of partner.

ENSEMBLES/GROUPS

Defined as four or more performers (limitations specified in each section must be observed)

- Primary School students may NOT compete in Secondary School sections. Exceptions for Speech & Drama. See Speech & Drama notes
- Where possible, schools with multiple entries will be scheduled as close as possible to allow for ease of transport.
- Students in Groups, Bands, Orchestras & Choirs are the responsibility of the teachers and parents who accompany them, not the Gladstone Eisteddfod Committee.

AMATEUR STATUS

All competitors 18 years & under are held under the auspices of the Gladstone Eisteddfod Association Inc. and are open to amateurs only. The term "amateur" is defined as one whose income is NOT derived from the exercise of their skills in the class for which he or she may have entered. This condition does not apply to Conductors or Accompanists of these sections.

For 19 & over sections – "AMATEUR" Status does NOT apply

WITHDRAWALS

Withdrawals need to be notified in writing as soon as possible, with Session, Section, Competitor Name and Number. This prevents scheduling issues that may affect competitors' Eisteddfod experiences.

OWN CHOICE SELECTIONS

Entrants are required to submit a copy of their selection for the Adjudicator via musicuploads.com.au. Some (but not all) Vocal and Instrumental sections allow for backing tracks; these too are required to be uploaded to Music Uploads.

There is a fee associated with using the program AND uploading to each discipline.

Competitors are required to submit their own selections via upload. Entries without uploads will be considered withdrawn. For assistance with Music Uploads, please reach out to the committee for support.

ASSOCIATION'S RESPONSIBILITY

The Association does not take responsibility for any instances of copyright infringement or royalty issues arising from the actions of individual performers or those associated with the performance. Performers who choose to photocopy music for the adjudicator do so at their own risk, and the Association holds no liability in such cases. Additionally, the Association is a member of the Association of Eisteddfod Societies of Australia. Entry fees include copyright licence fees for APRA, AMCOS, ARIA, and PPCA. Therefore, Schools and Teachers are not required to provide their own licences for these organizations.

COMPETITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY

Competitors must observe all requirements in relation to the photocopying of music and words. If the competitor is not performing from memory, an original or licenced photocopy must be used in the performance. It is the competitors' responsibility to read and ensure music uploads requirements are met.

GUIDELINE OF USE OF ORIGINAL AND COPIES

- 1. The original is used by the competitor for performance (unless performing from memory)
- 2. The first copy is for the adjudicator, from the digital submission by the competitor
- 3. The second copy (if required) is used by the accompanist and must be destroyed immediately after the performance
- 4. The Copyright Declaration form is completed

SUBMISSION IN THE CORRECT SECTION IS RESPONSIBILITY OF THE COMPETITOR. The committee can assist if an appropriate amount of notice is given. If no notice is given, the competitor will be given the opportunity to perform non-competing.

ADJUDICATION AND AWARDS

ADJUDICATOR APPOINTMENT

The Association will appoint independent adjudicators for each Category. If through unforeseen circumstances an adjudicator is unable to perform their duties, the Association reserves the right to appoint a substitute. Private pupils of an Adjudicator within twelve (12) months of the Eisteddfod may not compete in any Sections to be judged by that adjudicator. Adjudicators' choices are final. This is their opinion and theirs only to make. We are not responsible for the adjudicators' choices.

ADJUDICATION PROCESS

Awards and placings shall be at the discretion of the adjudicator whose decision is final. The adjudicators have the power to withhold or divide prizes according to merit. Marks are awarded based on various discipline-specific elements at the professional discretion of the adjudicator.

- Solo, Duo/Trio prize winners are awarded a certificate and ribbon per performer.
- Highly Commended certificates will be awarded as recommended by the Adjudicator.
- Ensemble, Group and Choir prize winners are awarded one certificate and ribbon per group. Prize money of \$40 for 1st place, \$30 for 2nd place and \$20 for 3rd place is also awarded and will be sent at the conclusion of all four disciplines. In the case of a tied result, the prize money will be shared.
- Certificates and ribbons will be awarded on stage except during Dance or at the discretion of the Adjudicator.

PROTESTS

The adjudicator's decision is final and may not be appealed. A protest for any other reason will be considered under the condition that the protest must be:

- made in writing and lodged to a committee member within half an hour of the protest arising
- accompanied by a fee of \$10, which shall be forfeited if the protest is considered unsubstantiated

Protests shall be investigated and decided by a panel of three members of the Committee, whose decision shall be final.

ADJUDICATOR CONTACT

No entrant, parent, teacher, or associate may approach an adjudicator during the Eisteddfod as this may affect the adjudicator's independence. Only the Coordinator of each discipline or a member of the Gladstone Eisteddfod Association Executive Committee (President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer) may converse with the Adjudicator. Should there be a problem, please speak to the Coordinator/Executive Committee representative.

PROGRAM

The Eisteddfod Program is published as the official guide to sections, time, and competitors. Any omissions or errors should be brought to the attention of the Association ASAP in writing. All participants are responsible for checking for any changes or amendments to the printed program. The committee will only give a start time for each session due to the nature of competitor withdrawals.

Digital programs of each discipline can be pre-purchased via order on Stardom for \$3 per discipline, to be sent via email when finalized. Printed copies can also be pre-purchased via Stardom for \$8 per discipline including postage and will also be available to purchase at local outlets for \$5 per discipline.

ORDER OF COMPETITION:

The order of competition will be programmed by each discipline coordinator for the official Program. This order of appearance must be strictly observed by competitors unless otherwise directed by the Adjudicator or Chairperson of the session. Failure to do so may result in disqualification.

No Competitor will be allowed to perform outside the specified time set for that Section.

PROGRAM CHANGES/SUBSTITUTIONS

- No person will be permitted to compete as a substitute for solo performers.
- Substitutions/additions to duo/trios are allowed, provided that (a) a written copy of the changes is communicated to the Eisteddfod Committee at least one hour prior to the commencement of the Session and (b) at least one member of the original entered duo/trio is competing.
- Duos may be increased to trios and trios reduced to duos but must communicated to the Eisteddfod Committee a week prior to the start date of each discipline.

VENUE AND PERFORMANCE REGULATIONS

CHECKING IN AND SIDE STAGE DOOR

- Soloists, Duo/Trios, and non-school Ensembles (Speech & Drama, Vocal and Instrumental) must check-in with the backstage volunteer via the <u>Stage Door</u>, located next to Door 2 from the foyer. Once checked-in, competitors will only be able to leave after the adjudication, or at the backstage volunteers' discretion. Please check in *two sections prior* to your performance.
- Entry through the side stage door will be permitted only at the discretion of the backstage volunteer.
- The side stage door is not to be used during performances.
- School Ensembles and Groups (Band, Orchestra and Choir) are to enter and exit through the
 <u>Basement Door</u> only. A tally of adults and students per school must be given to the basement volunteer
 at entry and checked off upon exit. It is the responsibility of each school for their role to be marked prior
 to entry. Teachers, please check in with backstage person two sections prior to your performance.
- Students in School Ensembles and Groups are the responsibility of the teachers and parents who accompany them, not the Gladstone Eisteddfod Committee.
- **Dance** competitors will be listed alphabetically under their studio name. Competitors are to mark off their name as they enter the backstage area.
- NO food or drinks except water are to be consumed past the Basement Door/Stage Door.
 Additional cleaning fees passed on the Eisteddfod Committee will be passed onto the respective competitor or studio to pay.

NON-COMPETITORS

- All non-competitors in the backstage area MUST wear closed-in shoes. This is a workplace health and Safety requirement and anyone who does not comply, will be asked to leave.
- No parents, friends or relatives of competitors are allowed on stage or in the wings unless as a committee official, accompanist, conductor or props person for the section being performed.
- Side-stage entry is at the discretion of the backstage coordinator's discretion.
- No 'coaching' allowed from the audience or from the wings to a competitor on stage

PROPS, EQUIPMENT AND STAGE ALTERATIONS

Gladstone Entertainment & Convention Centre Policies

- Props are to be restricted to minimal/handheld only. No items will be permitted which entail the use of such things as sand, water, smoke, fog, loose glitter powder, dry ice, cream, food or drink, powder, glass, hay bales, electrical appliances, or the lighting of matches on stage for effect purposes.
- All electrical equipment using the mains (i.e., guitars, amplifiers, keyboards, power boards, leads etc.)
 must carry a current electrical safety check tag. Use of equipment without a tag will not be permitted,
 without exception.

Eisteddfod Policies

- Competitors, where appropriate, should make their own arrangements for prop assistants
- The stage is to be set for the next item within one minute.
- Large props can be removed through the roller door in between sessions. Prior approval is required.

- All props are to be removed as quickly as possible from the backstage area. Anything left at the end of the Eisteddfod will be destroyed by the centre.
- School Banners or props/decorations displaying studio logos are not permitted.
- Aisles, passageways and exits must be kept clear at all times.
- No alterations to the stage lighting will be allowed.
- Excessive volume of amplified music is not acceptable. Penalties may be incurred.
- Be aware that curtains are NOT permitted during the Eisteddfod

CODE OF CONDUCT

In the spirit of running a positive and productive Eisteddfod, general rules regarding behaviour as a competitor, teacher, parent, student, audience member or any other participant of the Gladstone Eisteddfod were introduced in 2021. It is a condition of entry to the Gladstone Eisteddfod that all must abide by these rules.

DO:

- respect the change rooms, basement area and convention rooms by keeping them tidy and clean.
- follow Gladstone Eisteddfod Volunteer requests.

The following will NOT be tolerated and may warrant further action from the Eisteddfod committee.

- Abuse of any kind of committee members, volunteers, adjudicator, competitors, or non-competitors
- Failure to respect others' belongings (i.e., props, costumes, instruments).
- Derogatory remarks that bring the nature of adjudication results and integrity of the Eisteddfod into disrepute in front of competitors, students and/bystanders.

We thank those that continually follow these rules. Failure to follow these may result in disciplinary action at the discretion of the Gladstone Eisteddfod Association Executive Committee.

AUDIENCE/COMPETITOR ETIQUETTE

Audience etiquette is a vital way of respecting our competitors as they strive to reach their full potential on the stage. While attending and watching our competitors, you are agreeing to adhere to these rules.

DO:

- turn your phone off or on silent. If you are waiting for a call, your phone may be left at the front desk who will pass it on.
- remain seated and quiet during performances. Teachers, Parents and Carers are responsible for the
 discipline and actions of people in their care during items in the Auditorium. Doors will be opened as the
 stage is preparing for the next competitor and will not be opened during performances.

DON'T:

- use flashlights, camera, audio and/or video recording equipment in the auditorium, side stage or dressing rooms. This is a GECC policy, as well as a Copyright/Child Protection Policy mandate. If you are caught recording, you will be asked to delete the footage.
- use derogatory remarks that bring the nature of adjudication results and integrity of the Eisteddfod into disrepute in front of competitors, students and/or bystanders.

TROPHIES AND BURSARIES

On Awards Night, several trophies and bursaries are awarded. The following guidelines apply.

Competitors that reside in the Gladstone Region are considered local. All other Competitors are non-local.

ENCOURAGEMENT AWARDS

May be given out to local solo performers who show promise, on the recommendation of the adjudicator. These are not necessarily prize winners.

BURSARY ALLOCATION

Bursaries will be awarded within the guidelines for each type of bursary. The Management Committee of the Gladstone Eisteddfod Association reserves the right to withhold a Bursary if, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, no eligible person has sufficient merit.



Santos GLNG has a bursary scheme of \$500 to recognise a local solo performer (18 years & under in each of the four disciplines.

ASSOCIATION BURSARIES - LOCAL

The Gladstone Eisteddfod Association will award one bursary valued at \$100.00 in each of the four disciplines. This bursary applies to a local solo performer, awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator.

ASSOCIATION BURSARY- NON-LOCAL

The Gladstone Eisteddfod Association will award one bursary of \$100.00 for the most outstanding non-local solo Dance Performer awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator.

FRIENDS OF THE THEATRE

The GECC's Friends of the Theatre offer an encouragement bursary valued at \$150.00 in each category for a local solo performer (residing in the Gladstone Region) awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator.

ACCOMPANIST GUILD OF QUEENSLAND

The Accompanist Guild of Queensland will offer a bursary (on even years) valued at \$50 for an accompanist under 18 years of age, awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES

All perpetual trophies remain the property of the Gladstone Eisteddfod Association. Competitors will also receive a Medallion and/or Certificate.

Important Instrumental Notes

- Own Choice any style or period of music unless specified
- Woodwind, Brass & Strings competitors must find their own accompanist if required.
- Music scored with an accompaniment must be performed with said accompaniment.
- In Primary and Secondary ensembles, groups and bands, competitors must be students at the school entered. Conductors, Staff and/or Parents are not permitted to perform with the students.
- Instrumental Ensembles can include all instruments unless stated otherwise. They are also permitted to enter the OPEN section as band members.
- School banners on music stands are not permitted on stage.
- In the combined schools band section, entrants must be from different schools or formed from a combination of Primary and Secondary Students.
- Fretted instruments should note they have a maximum time of 1 minute to set up on stage prior to performing.
- Fretted Instruments may use an accompanist.
- All bands, choirs, ensembles, and groups must submit full scores for the adjudicator.
- Individuals may compete up to 2 times within one Duo/Trio category i.e., String Duo/Trio,
 Woodwind/Brass/Percussion Duo/Trio etc. provided there is a change of instrument.
- Students can play in more than one ensemble if:
 - they play a different instrument in each group. For example, a student can play the trumpet in one concert band and French Horn in another concert band.
 - they play the same instrument, however it must be in different ensemble types, for example a saxophone player may play in one concert band and one jazz band, but they are not to play in two jazz bands.
- Own Compositions are allowed providing a copy is given to the adjudicator.
- There are no set pieces this year. The two contrasting pieces should be at the level of the section entered. Time limits however will be enforced, with time starting from the first note to the last note.
- Concert and Stage Bands are to set up as per stage plans (located on our website and Facebook page)
 to limit equipment movement. Stage transition time rules still apply.
- There will be a set stage plan for our strings, concert, and jazz bands. This will be communicated out.

Definitions

Australian Poet

A poet who is Australian born, a naturalized Australian, or a Poet who is widely published in Australian Anthologies or whose themes are recognizably Australian

- In group improvisation, all groups must be completely unique with no individual competing in more than one performance.
- Group Mimes: Individuals may compete in more than one group as long as they are the correct age.
- Character Performances (Character Recital, Duologue, Mime, Shakespeare) should have title and author presented to the Chairperson who will announce the title before the performance
- All pieces must show Title and Author where applicable
- In Speech & Drama competitors must not use pre-recorded electronic accompaniment or backing for character recitals or dramatic scenes unless specified for that particular section.
- Individuals may compete up to 2 times within one Duo/Trio category (not improvisation) provided there is a change of partner.
- Individuals who are under 12 can compete in Group Improvisation/Group Mime 13-18 years (sections 570 & 577). However, competitors who are 13-18 may not compete in under 12 groups.

Definitions

Classical	. Songs in classical style. This includes Art song, Lieder, Operatic Aria, and Operetta.
Folk	. Traditional Songs most often passed down and with no known composer. Minimal if any accompaniment used.
Sacred	. Songs of a religious nature. This includes Spiritual, Gospel Contemporary, song form Oratorio or songs of Praise.
Stage Show, Film or Musical	. Songs taken from musical stage productions or films. This also includes Gilbert & Sullivan. Songs MUST be in character.
Modern	. Songs in a contemporary/non-classical style singing only e.g., pop, rock, ballad, folk, jazz, hip hop, country etc. For purposes of this Eisteddfod Folk, Jazz/Blues and country have separate sections and are not to be used in the Modern Section. Songs from film must NOT be in character.
Jazz/Blues	. Songs performed in the style of Jazz or Blues. Improvisation, melodic and rhythmic variation and/or Scat are encouraged. Songs from film must NOT be in character.
Country	. Style and genre of largely string-accompanied American popular music having roots in the folk music of the Southeast and cowboy music of the West. Songs from film must NOT be in character.
Self-Accompanied	. A song where the vocalist plays their own accompaniment.

- All sections require one piece for performance unless otherwise written
- Entrants must supply a score. All parts must be present on scores submitted

- All competitors are required to make arrangements for their own accompaniment (be it piano/guitar/backing track). Contact details of the accompanist can be given on request.
- Entrants must ensure backing tracks are uploaded to music uploads by the specified date.
- It is the entrant's responsibility to have a back-up loaded on a device/USB on their person on the day should technical difficulties arise
- Backing tracks must NOT include backing vocals
- Primary and Secondary Choirs/Ensembles must be from the same school. Otherwise, enter the Open section
- All Duos/Trios must incorporate part work (harmony)
- Competitors can compete up to two times in each duo/trio section, providing there is a complete change
 of partner/s (no two entrants are to compete together twice)
- Substitutions can be made providing the rule above is adhered to
- Duo/Trio/Ensembles must compete at the age level of the oldest group member

Important Dance Notes

Definitions

Jazz	. All Jazz Items (including championships) must be Up Tempo. They must use Jazz technique, not Hip-Hop or Broadway Jazz.
Lyrical	. Dance movements not held by the rigid constraints of classical ballet. However, the movements should demonstrate a flowing effect of the human form while interpreting the words and/or feelings of the music or song.
Contemporary	Abstract dance movements not bound by the restrictive rules of classical ballet. A style of theatrical/tribal dance that rejects the limitations of classical ballet, and favours movements deriving from the expression of inner feelings.
Hip Hop	. Energetic dance movements that are derived from break-dancing but does not consist wholly of break-dancing moves. Unlike most other forms of dance, hip hop dance has few (if any) limitations on positions or steps. It is about the attitude and creativity of the dancer and the choreographer.
Broadway Jazz	. A theatre style jazz that emphasises the characterisation of theatricality found in musical theatre performances.

- All Solo and Duo/Trio competitors must purchase a competitor's pass. This pass does not include Groups Day.
- All competitors entering the backstage area must check in and out with the basement door person.
- Competitors entering Championships must also compete in their own age groups for both of the following sections:
 - Classical Championship: Classical Solo and Character/Demi-Character Solo
 - o Tap Championship: Tap Solo and Waltz Tap Solo
 - Modern Championship: Jazz Solo and Contemporary or Lyric/Free Movement Solo
- Championship dances one dance may have been previously performed in this Eisteddfod, but one
 must be new choreography.
- Time limits will be strictly enforced and will incur a points deduction as penalty.
- Excessive volume of amplified music is not acceptable. Penalties may be incurred.
- Musical exits are allowed but only within the designated time limits.
- Tap Shoes must be covered at all times in the Foyer, Auditorium and Backstage.
- Jazz and Tap Solo Sections are restricted to a chair or hand-held prop only e.g., hat, fan etc. Otherwise, they are classed as a Novelty Solo.
- Interpretive Sections: Class uniform is to be worn (No jewellery or logos).
- Individuals may compete up to 2 times within one Duo/Trio category i.e., Classical/Story Ballet, Tap/Character Tap etc. provided there is a change of partner or style/discipline.
- Props must be delivered to the loading dock 15min prior to the session (not section).
- GROUPS Individuals may compete more than once in the same genre. Dancers are able to perform in an older age section as well as their own age section. All group entrants must be 18 years & under.
- Anyone 19 years & over must compete in Mature & Motivated.
- GROUP PROPS are to be restricted to a minimum. The stage is to be set and cleared within 1 minute, using your own crew.

- A group consists of a minimum of 4 dancers.
- Schools must provide adequate supervision for all groups.
- Dressing rooms will be allocated to dance schools for GROUPS DAY ONLY.
- Competitors are responsible for keeping the dressing rooms clean and tidy.
- Competitors may use any dressing room during solo, duo or trio sections. One backstage dressing room will be allocated as a 'boys only' dressing room.
- No adult males are permitted in the female dressing rooms
- No loose glitter is to be used.
- Costumes & Music must be age appropriate
- iPod and MP3 players are preferred
- Tights are compulsory for competitors 12 years and over
